Publish names, reasons for excluding 65 lakh electors in Bihar, SC tells EC

The Supreme Court, in an interim order on Thursday, directed the Election Commission of India (EC) to publish an enumerated, booth-wise list of approximately 65 lakh electors not included in the draft electoral roll published on August 1 during the ongoing Special Intensive Revision (SIR) exercise in poll-bound Bihar.

A Bench of Justices Surya Kant and Joymalya Bagchi instructed that the list should be complete with the individual reasons — death, migration, untraceability, duplicate registrations — for each exclusion on the draft roll. "If, according to you, 22 lakh of the 65 lakh non-included voters are dead, why are their names not being disclosed? There is a narrative doing the rounds that family members do not know their kin have been left out as dead in the draft roll. If you put out the names in the public do-

main for all to see, that narrative disappears... In short, we want a 'Poonam Devi's family in Bihar to know that her name has been deleted because she is dead,' Justice Kant addressed the EC, represented by senior advocate Rakesh Dwivedi.

SEEK TRANSPARENCY
The court upheld the voters' "right to know" and Constitutional right to remain on the electoral roll. "People have a right to know. A high degree of transparency is re-

quired to inspire voters' confidence. Put up the names of excluded electors with reasons out there in the public domain for all to see," it said.

The 65 lakh names, out of 7.89 crore registered electors, were dropped from the draft roll despite being featured in the voters' list prepared after a summary revision in January 2025. The court ordered the EC to publish the non-included voters' list and reasons on the websites of the District Electoral Officers (DEOs) across Bihar. Phys-

ical lists have to be displayed on the notice boards of the booth level officers (BLOs), block development/panchayat offices to facilitate manual access. The EC has to provide the Bihar Chief Electoral Officer with soft copies of the list and reasons for displaying on the CEO's official website. The poll body has to arrange wide publicity by issuing a "layman-friendly" public notice in vernacular and English newspapers, on radio, TV and authorised social media platforms about the publication of the list.

"For a migrant worker who has been deleted as dead, even if he is illiterate, his neighbours or friends would alert him... It is only fair to have a procedure that does not block a person from exercising his right to adult franchise," Justice Kant pointed out to the EC.

PROOF OF ID
Aggrieved electors whose names were not included could file their objections by applying with an Aadhaar

copy. "Aadhaar is a statutorily recognised instrument of identity and residence. It can be submitted as a document," Justice Bagchi observed. This is the first time the court has directed the use of Aadhaar as proof of identity and residence in the Bihar SIR exercise. The EC would compile the proof of compliance from BLOs/DEOs and place on record before the court a collated status report on August 22. The list and reasons should be searchable by typing in the EPIC number. The interim order would act as a precedent in future legal disputes regarding SIR exercises in other States.

The EC initially resisted the court's decision, saying it had BLOs and booth level agents working to assist the left-out voters and usher them back on the electoral roll. But the court said the voters' right to know about the deletion and their Constitutional entitlement to be on the electoral roll cannot be dependent on agents of political parties.

Aster DM charts 5-year push

Aster DM Healthcare has set its sights on expanding its footprint in Karnataka, Kerala and Central India, which Deputy Managing Director Alisha Moopen describes as the company's "key growth hubs" over the next five years. "For us, the big goal over the next five years is really going to consolidate the position in Kerala, Karnataka and central India," she told *businessline*.

The company has been present in Kerala since 2001 and currently operates six multi-specialty hospitals with 2,653 beds, 201 laboratories and 84 pharmacies, offering integrated healthcare solutions. While competition is intensifying in Kerala, Moopen views this as a sign of a healthy

and growing ecosystem.

The Kerala cluster, she noted, witnessed temporary softness due to leadership transitions that impacted momentum. However, performance is now steadily improving, with a clear pickup in patient volumes and occupancy. Over the next three years, Aster will add 818 beds in Kerala, including two major greenfield projects—the 264-bed Aster Kasargod and the

454-bed Aster Capital in Thiruvananthapuram. In Hyderabad, the company is planning to commission a 300-bed hospital for women and children.

In Bengaluru, Aster will expand capacity by 1,439 beds—350 beds at Aster CMI Hospital, 159 beds at Aster Whitefield and 930 beds across its newly announced hospitals on Sarjapur Road and Yeshwanthpur.

As part of its Central India push, Aster has merged with Blackstone-backed Quality Care India Ltd (QCIL). According to Moopen, the deal opens up significant opportunities in Central India, where QCIL's units—operational for the past 5-10 years—offer scope to strengthen Aster's presence and achieve micro-market leadership.

Economy is in the pink of health, says President Murmu

President Droupadi Murmu on Thursday said India's economy is "in the pink of health" and the country is well on its way to becoming a developed nation by 2047, with growth powered by calibrated reforms and "sagacious economic management" by the Modi government.

In her address to the nation on the eve of the 79th Independence Day, the President said India clocked a 6.5 per cent GDP growth rate in the last fiscal, making it the fastest-growing major eco-

nomy even amid global headwinds. "Demand at home is pacing ahead, inflation is under control, exports are rising. All key indicators show the economy in the pink of health," she noted.

She credited the combination of calibrated reforms and sagacious economic management alongside the contribution of farmers, workers, and entrepreneurs for the buoyancy, while highlighting rising infrastructure investments, digital transformation and welfare initiatives that have lifted millions out of poverty and narrowed income gaps.

Murmu said regional disparities are fading, weaker

states are catching up, and India's self-reliance push is boosting confidence. "The all-round economic growth complemented by social sector initiatives has placed India well on the path to becoming a developed

State of India by 2047," she said, stressing that youth, women, and formerly marginalised communities will be key drivers of this journey.

OPERATION SINDOOR
She said Operation Sindoor demonstrated that our armed forces are prepared to meet any eventuality when it comes to guarding the nation. The world has taken note of India's stance that we will not be aggressor but will also not hesitate to retaliate in defence of our citizens, she stressed. "I believe, Operation Sindoor will go down in history as an example in humanity's fight against terrorism," the President ob-

served. Operation Sindoor, according to her, was also a test case of the Atmanirbhar Bharat mission in the defence sector.
